Highlights

The regular meeting of the Central Bucks Detachment of the Marine Corps League of Pennsylvania, Inc., was held March 12, 1997, at Albert E. Atkinson American Legion Post #210, 315 North Street, Doylestown, PA.

There were 22 members present including all officers. Distinguished Marines in attendance included Past Commandants Don Parzanese Sr., Budd Pearce, Bill Plant, and Frank Yohe; Department of New Jersey Past Commandant Ed Hoth; and Marine of the Year Ray Krout. Two guests were also present.

The Minutes of the February Meeting were unanimously approved.

Paymaster Bob Cody issued the Paymaster's Report. The report was unanimously accepted.

The Commandant reported he had appeared before the Bucks County Commissioners in conjunction with his position with the Bucks County World War II Memorial Committee. He also attended the Southeast Division Meeting on March 9 in Newtown Square. The major topic of discussion was the proposed Department of Pennsylvania Headquarters to be established at Ft. Indiantown Gap. More information will be forthcoming. This issue will be discussed and voted upon at the Department Convention.

Senior Vice Commandant Bill Rosenberger reported the Detachment membership strength was at 54 with 34 regular members, 6 associate members, 14 life members, and 8 delinquent members.

Junior Vice Commandant Ernie Ortiz reported Department of Pennsylvania Annual Raffle Tickets had been distributed and additional tickets are available.

Adjutant Ray Krout reported on communications received from the Department of Pennsylvania. No coomunications from Marine Corps League Headquarters.

Sergeant-at-Arms Bob Sundling reported no requests had been received for the Color Guard since the last meeting.

Chaplain Budd Pearce, PC, reported the Detachment had received no reports of anyone sick or in distress and that he had received no nominations for the Chapel of Four Chaplains' "Legion of Honor." He also stated he would pick up Marine Marlin Miller and bring him to the next meeting.

Judge Advocate Don Parzanese Sr., PC, reported there were no legal matters pending Ouartermaster Don Parzanese Jr. had nothing to report.




