

OLDEST PENNSYLVANIA MARINE CELEBRATES 105th BIRTHDAY

DARBY, P, Nov. 23--The nation's oldest living Marine is celebrating his 105th birthday herte today.

His birthday is November 25, 1906, but Wednesday was a special birthday celebration for the nation's oldest Marine.

Al DeSerio or "Sarge" to his fellow devil dogs and those here at the St. Francis Country House, where he lives, was feted today by a delegation of active duty Marines from the Upper Darby Detachment Marine Corps League.

Sarge was a member of the U.S. Marine Corps for 42 years, on active duty in the Korean War, and completing two tours of duty in Vietnam.

He told me his proudest time was serving as an escort for the war dead in World War II.

"When anybody was killed in World War II, I would escort them to their homes," Sarge said. "It was the best job I ever had. I was proud to do it."

He says he is also proud of his eight stars for good conduct, and one of the best days for the Marines, he says, was when women enlisted.

"It was good to have them," said Sarge. "They were replacing the men in 1942, and they brought the black Marines in 1942.

Sarge retired from military duty in 1970 and worked at Fitzgerald Mercy Hospital until 1988.

He credits his longevity to lots of exercise.

Those who love him the most are the residents here at St. Francis Country House.

His best friend, the oldest fireman at Darby Fire Company Number 1, who says he's always in a good mood.

"He's a great guy, always laughing," he said. "You can't make Sarge mad."

"I feel very good," said Sarge. "I feel like I'm sitting on top of the world."

ond floor of the Bucks County Courthouse (55 E. Court St., Doylestown, PA 18901).

By showing their DD-214 discharge form (or having staff look it up if already filled in the Recorder of Deeds office), they will be able to receive a color photo identification card that will entitle them to special discounts at local businesses.

The program kicked off with almost 100 veterans posing for ID pictures in the large hall of the Warminster VFW Post. Many of them expressed appreciation for the opportunity to carry a simpler form of veterans ID than the traditional paperwork that denotes their service to the United States.

"We are very excited to launch this program for our veterans' community, which numbers more than 50,000 in Bucks County," Chairman Martin stated.

"Through this program, we will support them and the 'veteran friendly' businesses who offer discounts for their goods and services."

According to Fraley, several large businesses are already on board, including Boscov's, Lowe's in to **Junior Vice Commandant Jack Gentile** as soon as possible. The deadline is the January meeting on the 11th. Semper Fi,

We invite all local merchants, restaurants and service providers to take part in the program," Fraley added.

"It is a great time to start the Veterans Discount Program, especially since Veterans Day is Friday, November 11 and the holiday shopping season is right around the corner," commented Commissioner Loughery, who was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Reserves following his graduation from Dickinson College.

Szafran invited all veterans to visit the Recorder of Deeds office for the twin purpose of filing their DD-214 papers and receiving a Veterans ID Discount card. "This card producing system is portable, as well, so we will be able to take it to events such as the Grange Fair and senior expos," Mr. Szafran said.


