#### Dear Veteran:

As you know, we are marking the 38th anniversary of the end of the Korean War with a special edition commemorative coin. The 38th anniversary is especially symbolic to those familiar with the conflict because it recalls the famous 38th Parallel.

Congress, through Public Law 101-495, has authorized the U.S. Mint to issue a limited number of Korean War Memorial Silver Dollars. Your display of the materials and promotion of the coin will help make the dream of a national Korean War Veterans Memorial a reality.

The Marine Corps League Charter was enacted by Congress on Tuesday 5 Janual 1937, in Section 2, Paragraph (a) it states, to preserve the traditions and promote the interests of the United States Marine Corps. Some of recent it∈ in the Newspapers, and some statements by a few General Officers of the Cor have left some people scratching their heads on how our Marine Corps can st on its present course, and perform its mission.

The word coming out of Washington is that, the Corps will be cut to 159,000 Marines, and that would make the Marine Corps Hollow. The Marines are the amphibious specialists, and with maritime prepositioning its the fastest way yet.

The League expects cuts in all of the Services, but do'nt agree with the drastic down-grading of the Marine Corps.
