

VA Medical Centers Extending Hours and Changing Benefits

WASHINGTON--In order to provide more health care for more veterans, especially mental health services, Secretary of Veterans Affairs Jim Nicholson has directed the 153 medical centers of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to keep their doors open longer.

"Illness doesn't follow a 9-to-5 schedule," Nicholson said. "I'm directing our medical centers to provide extended hours to ensure we're there for the veterans who have earned our care."

Although the extra hours apply to many hospital-based programs and services, Nicholson said his latest decision was based upon a desire to ensure VA's more than 9,000 mental health professionals are available when veterans need them.

VA operates the largest integrated health care system in the country and the nation's largest mental health program. About 5.5 million veterans are expected to seek health care from VA's nationwide system this year, accounting for about 800,000 hospitalizations and 60 million outpatient visits.

In recent months, Nicholson has announced a number of initiatives to improve mental health care for returning combat veterans, including the hiring of suicide prevention coordinators for each medical center, 100 new

GEN. PACE PLEDGES BEST 'TIL END

NORFOLK, VA--Although he would never voluntarily leave the battlefield while troops are at war, **Marine General Peter Pace** said he accepts the decision to not renominate him for a second term.



On June 8, **Defense Secretary Robert** M. Gates announced that he was going to recommend that President Bush nominate Admiral Michael G. Mullen as Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff rather than nominate Pace for another two-year term.

Pace discussed that decision process in response to a question posed following an address to students, faculty, and local military and community leaders at the Joint Forces Staff College here last month. The General was the featured speaker of the Henry Clay Hofheimer

Lecture Series.

The General said that he and Gates discussed whether Pace should voluntarily retire and take the decision off the table.

"I said I could not do it for one very fundamental reason, and that is that 'PFC Pace' in Baghdad should not think ever that his Chairman, whoever that person is, could have stayed in the battle and voluntarily walked off the battlefield," he said.

Out of his sense of leadership, he could not even consider the idea, Pace said. Therefore, he did not submit his retirement papers until after it became publicly known that he was not going to be renominated.

"That is very important to me," Pace said. "That piece holds true for anybody in this position -- anybody."

The General learned of the dilemma in May, within a day or two of the Secretary learning from some members of Congress that they had concerns about renominating Pace.

"He brought me in the office and sat me down and said: 'Pete, this is what's happening. I want to renominate you. I want you to know that this is what I'm beginning to hear; this is what I'm going to go do; this is how I'm going to go do it," Pace said.

Gates went back to the Senate and "pulsed" some of the members. Pace told the Secretary that he was "all for it" if Gates wanted to push forward with the renomination.

But Pace also told the Secretary to do



what he thought was best for the institution. "Whatever he and the President decided was going to be best for the institution was what Pete Pace was going to do," the general said.

During the June 8 news conference, Gates said confirmation hearings for Pace would be contentious and not in the best interests of the country.

"I am no stranger to contentious confirmations, and I do not shrink from them," Gates said. "However, I have decided that at this moment in our history, the nation, our men and women in uniform, and General Pace himself would not be well served by a divisive ordeal in selecting the next chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff."



In his remarks last month, Pace also spoke of a more personal reason that effected his decision to not voluntarily retire.

"The other piece for me personally was that some 40 years ago I left some guys on the battlefield in Vietnam who lost their lives following Second Lieutenant Pace," he said. "I promised myself then that I will serve this country until I was ish line I will have met the mission I set for myself," he said to a standing ovation.





- * No pins, medals or any other devices shall be worn on the MCL Cover other than the EGA.
- * Either DOD or MCL ribbons to be worn oneeighth inch above the left breast pocket of white short sleeve aviator shirt. DO NOT INTER MIX!
- * Shooting badges will not be worn with MCL ribbons.
- * MCL Ribbons ONLY on the MCL Ceremonial Uniform (khaki shirt)). No DOD ribbons or Shooting Badges to be worn.
- * Miniature medals may be worn on the Blazer as part of the MCL Formal Uniform (tuxedo shirt, bow tie).
- * Large medals may be worn on the MCL Mess Jacket.
