
Scholarship Committee

May 8th NCO exams were held at the Army Reserve Center resulting in 10 Young Marines becoming eligible for promotions.



Who Says So?

Editor:

"Uncertain Trumpet at Defense" (editorial, Jan. 17), like "Who Needs Four Air Forces?" (editorial, Nov. 30), obliges me to ask the question: "Who says so?"

Editorial statements like "Each service likes to operate on its own which leads to costly duplication"; "Army and Marine helicopters can provide close air support to ground troops without relying on the Air Force," and "The Marines don't need fixed-wing aircraft of their own when the Navy has more than enough" lack any support in fact in your editorial and demonstrate a want of knowledge and understanding of the roles and functions of the services.

Perhaps it's the constant second-guessing of those of us with 35 or so years in our profession by would-be experts, whose knowledge of the facts and opinions presented is thin at best, that prompts me, in the frailty of being human, to offer a suggestion:

Why not let one newspaper print all the news and then everybody could read it? We could cut down on the number of printing presses, save millions of the trees we cut down to make pulp paper and undoubtedly reduce the cost of the newspaper to the average citizen because overhead costs would be cut drastically.

Sound like a dumb idea? Probably so. But then I haven't spent 35 years in the newspaper business and don't know much about how to run one.

I have, however, spent that much time as a Marine and figure I know something about how to run a Marine Corps.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Purpose: To Grant Scholarships to Qualified Applicants in Order of Preference and Need as Follows:

1. Sons and daughters of Marines who lost their lives in the line of duty.
2. Sons and daughters of active Marine Corps Leaguers and/or Auxiliary members.
3. Members of the Marine Corps League or an honorably discharged Marine in need of rehabilitation training not provided in government programs.
4. To any person seeking further education and training upon written recommendation of the Commandant of any active chartered Detachment of the Marine Corps League or the President of an active chartered Unit of the Auxiliary if the funds are unavailable. Grandchildren come under this.

Requirements Necessary to Be Considered for a Scholarship Grant:

1. Applicant must complete the Scholarship Application Form.
2. An accompanying letter of recommendation from the Commandant of an active chartered Detachment of the Marine Corps League, or from the President of an active chartered Unit of the Auxiliary, stating that an investigation of need has been made.
3. An accompanying letter from a representative from the applicant's High School stating the applicant's ability and the school's recommendation as to further education and a transcript of the applicant's grades.
4. An accompanying letter from the applicant with a brief life history with a recent photograph attached.
5. Three (3) letters of recommendation from persons other than the applicant's family who have known the applicant for five (5) years or more must be attached.
6. Proof of educational institution's acceptance of applicant must be attached.
7. Documentation should be assembled as enumerated above and submitted by the applicant.

All requirements for consideration of grants must be postmarked no later than July 1.

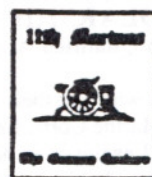

Campaign for Books

Many Marines and friends of the Corps are raising \$10 million in private funds to provide state-of-the-art resources that will enable Marines of all ranks access to its educational and operational collections. In addition to new library technologies, private funds will also provide archival expansion and 250,000 supplementary volumes on amphibious operations and expeditionary warfare.

Of the naming opportunities available in the Command and Staff College Foundation's fund-raising effort, one of the most popular is the campaign for books.
