Highlights

The regular meeting of the Central Bucks Detachment of the Marine Corps League of Pennsylvania, Inc., was held May 13, 1998, at Albert E. Atkinson American Legion Post #210, 315 North St., Doylestown, PA.

There were 22 members present including all officers except **Junior Vice Commandant Paul Caprio** (excused) and **Chaplain Don Parzanese Jr.** Distinguished Marines in attendance included: **National Public Relations Officer Don Gee** ; and **Past Commandants Don Parzanese Sr., Frank Yohe and Don Gee.**

The Minutes of the April Meeting were unanimously approved.

The Paymasters Report was presented by **Paymaster Bob Cody**. He stipulated the report did not include the proceeds from DelVal College's "A"-Day Parking. Those funds were deposited May 1 and will be included in next month's report.

Two new members were inducted into the Detachment--**Garry Preiss and William Cole**. Both are active duty Marines assigned to MAG-49 at Willow Grove. They will be running the Bux-Mont Young Marines Unit.

Commandant Budd Pearce reviewed some of the correspondence the Detachment had received. The company which manufactures the MCL Red Blazer has raised its prices. The new price list will be available on the Senior Vice's table at the June Meeting. There were also some National By-Laws changes which will be proposed at the National Convention. He also reviewed the Memorial Day activities and upcoming events. The Detachment will be participating in the Memorial Day Parade in Sellersville on Saturday, May 23, and the Doylestown Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 25. The Detachment Color Guard will also be participating in the World War II Monument Dedication Ceremony on Saturday, May 30. Other planned events for the Color Guard include the Bucks County Firemen Parade on June 13; the Dedication of the new Recreation Field in Warrington; and, the Special Olympics on June 23. The Detachment will also be taking part in the New Britain Township 4th of July Parade.

Senior Vice Commandant Don Gee, PC, reported the Detachment strength to be 51 members. We have 15 Life Members, 5 Associate Members, and 31 Regular Members. The Detachment has four members delinquent in their dues.

In the absence of the Junior Vice Commandant, Sr. Vice Gee reported the Department of Pennsylvania Raffle money and tickets are due. Tickets for the Detachment's "California Suite" show on July 12 are still available at \$10.00 each.

Heritage Foundation To Help Fund Heritage Center

QUANTICO, VA--Now that the U.S. Marine Corps has announced plans to consider creation of a Marine Corps Heritage Center that would be located at Marine Corps Base, Quantico, VA, the recently renamed Marine Corps Heritage Foundation (formerly the Marine Corps Historical Foundation) is launching plans to assist with this long-term project. The Foundation is exploring potential sources of private funds for a portion of the funding for the Center.

Although plans are still in the study phase, those involved with planning for the Center, including members of the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation, indicate it has the potential to be a major regional attraction for visitors, scholars, historians, and students. Located adjacent to Interstate 95 and U.S. Route 1, the Center would be a showplace for highlighting the Marine Corps' varied capabilities before numerous diverse and distinguished guests. Located at what Marines call the "Crossroads of the Marine Corps," it is expected to attract and educate visitors from throughout the United States and around the world.

General Charles C. Krulak, Commandant of the Marine Corps, has said "The Marine Corps Heritage Center is envisioned as a multi-use complex of buildings and outdoor facilities. It will be devoted to the presentation of Marine Corps history, professional military educational opportunities and unique military events. This complex, with its varied capabilities, will be the showcase for our Marine Corps heritage: its glorious past, present and future."

Established in 1979, the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation is a non-profit [501(c)(3)] organization dedicated to the preservation and protection of Marine Corps history and traditions. It directly supports the historical programs of the Marine Corps in ways that otherwise might not be available through government funding.

In announcing its recent name change, LtGen. Philip D. Shutler, USMC (Ret.), Chairman of the Foundation's Board of Directors, stated, "The change was made to better reflect the multi-purpose role of the foundation--preserving, protect-

ing, and promoting the heritage of our Corps into the next century."

Foundation membership is open to all who have an interest in preserving the history and traditions of the Marine Corps and in sharing the spirit of "Semper

Contract Cuts Cost of Long Distance Calls For Veteran Hospital Patients

VA patients making long-distance calls from bedside phones should find it a little less expensive thanks to the agency's new \$35 million contract with MCI for operator-assisted long-distance services at VA hospitals.

The contract offers long-distance calling card and pay phone services as well as service to 40,000 patient bedside phones. It will cover 172 medical centers nationwide.

John Metzger, MCI's branch manager for VA contracts, said the \$35 million figure represented an estimate of the amount of money MCI expects to make,

although he added that the pact does not include a limit on how much revenue the company can obtain during the next five years.

VA has only begun offering bedside phones to most patients within the last two years thanks to "Operation Phone Home."

Members of the Communications Workers of America, AT&T, and Bell Atlantic joined forces to provide the cabling and telephones to patients in VA hospitals because Congress forbids medical centers from paying for patient telephones and/or patient telephone calls.

New SSI Beneficiaries Will Be Paid by Direct Deposit

New applicants for Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are having their monthly benefit payment deposited directly into their bank account.

Sinclair fall, people who have applied for Social Security and SSI have also had the convenience of direct deposit. That policy also applies to people who receive any federal benefit payment, federal wage, salary or retirement payment, or vendor and expense reimbursement payment.

When you apply for benefits, be sure to have your bank information with you—documents that show your financial institution and your account, such as a personal check, savings passbook, or an account statement.

Those already on the Social Security and SSI rolls, who get checks, will continue to be paid by check unless they opt to change to direct deposit. Also, new beneficiaries who don't have a bank account will be paid by check.

With direct deposit, your money is available the same day you would have received a check. The difference is your money is sent directly to your bank. Following are some advantages to direct deposit:

- * It's safer - there is no risk of theft or loss through the mail.
- * It's reliable - there is an electronic record of all payments.
- * It's economical - payments are credited on the scheduled payment day. A number of financial institutions have special accounts for those who use direct deposits.

* It's convenient - no worries when you are vacationing or otherwise away from home.

About 61 percent of the 43 million people who get Social Security already receive their payment through direct deposit. If the 24 million Social Security and SSI beneficiaries who now receive checks changed to direct deposit, the savings to the taxpayers would be \$9.6 million a month. The government saves 40 cents each time someone uses direct deposit instead of a check. It costs 42 cents to process and mail each check, compared to 2 cents for direct deposit.


