Korea War Service Medal Approved

WASHINGTON--The Department of Defense recently announced the criteria for U. S. military veterans of the Korean War to wear the Republic of Korea's War Service Medal (ROKWSM). The eligibility period and criteria are specified by the Republic of Korea.

To wear the foreign medal on U.S. military uniforms, U.S. military personnel must have served between the outbreak of hostilities, June 25, 1950, and the date the armistice was signed, July 27, 1953.

They must have been on permanent assignment or on temporary duty for 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive

days. And their duty must have been performed within the territorial limits of Korea, in the waters immediately adjacent thereto or in aerial flight over Korea participating in actual combat operations or in support of combat operations.

The ROKWSM was originally offered in 1951 to United Nations Forces serving in Korea and adjacent waters.

Although other nations subsequently approved the wearing of the medal for their military veterans, for reasons unknown the medal was never officially accepted or authorized for U.S. military veterans.

Highlights

The regular meeting of the Central Bucks Detachment, Inc., of the Marine Corps League of Pennsylvania, was held April 12, 2000, at Albert E. Atkinson American Legion Post #210, 315 North St., Doylestown, PA.

Distinguished members and guests in attendance included **National Director of Public Relations** and **Past Commandant Don Gee, Department of Pennsylvania Commandant Terry Bergman, Dept. WAR MEDAL *(From Page 1)*

At the urging of veterans organizations, in 1998 the government of the Republic of Korea reaffirmed that its original offer of the ROKMSM was still valid. On Aug. 20, 1999, the Secretary of Defense approved the acceptance and wear of the medal.

Since then, the Defense Department has been reviewing the guidelines for eligibility and purchase with the Republic of Korea, Korean and U.S. civilian manufacturers, and various veterans organizations.

U.S.-sanctioned medals can only be purchased from the Republic of Korea designated manufacturer or from other organizations that have contracted to market the Korean firm's product. Information on the Korean manufacturer can be found by visiting the Korean War Commemoration Committee internet website at <http://korea50.army.mil/>.

Because the U.S. Government did not issue the medal, there is no system in place to review or approve an applicant's eligibility. Thus, no proof of eligibility is required for purchase.

Other, non-authentic versions of the medal may also be available through various commercial manufacturers and organizations. If the Korean manufacturer does not license the production of these medals, they do not meet the U.S. criteria for wear on the military uniform.

Because the Order of Precedence for non-U.S. service medals and ribbons is determined by the date of approval, the

ROKMSM should be worn after the Kuwait Liberation Medal, which was the last medal previously awarded by a foreign government to U.S. military personnel.

For the majority of Korean War veterans, the medal will be worn after the United Nations Medal, or the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, if they served in that conflict.

Also deemed eligible by the Republic of Korea include: Military personnel, workers, and policemen who either served in--or through some special duty --deployed to and returned from the combat zone during the Korean War; Service members and employees who served in relation to the theater of war--even if not on duty in the theater of combat--through unit relation to the theater of war--even if not on duty in the theater of combat--through unit mobili-

zation or integration into temporarily constituted units; Rail workers and mariners supporting military transportation; Employees who supported military communications; and combat theater nurses who served patients wounded in the theater of combat.

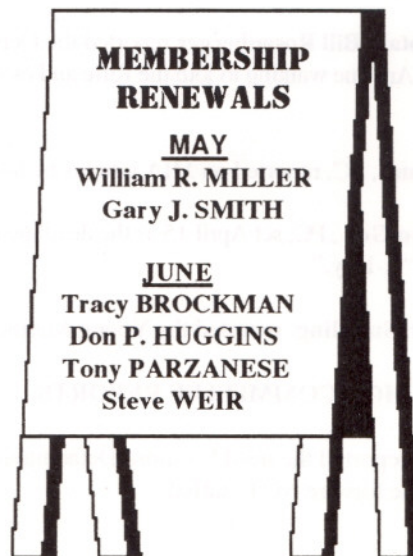
A Department spokesman said the effort was expedited because "we want to ensure that all of our U.S. veterans have the opportunity to wear the medal at the 50th Anniversary events at Arlington National Cemetery and the Korean War Veterans Memorial on June 25, 2000."

Cost of the medal from the ROK manufacturer is: one miniature medal, Won 5,000 (approx. \$4.25); one medal, Won 10,000 (approx. \$8.50). Shipping cost is about Won 1,500 (approx. \$1.25). The manufacturer will accept ONLY money orders. **No checks or credit cards can be used to pay for the medal.** No requisition form is available from the manufacturer and no website will be established.

Versions of the medal are also available through various civilian manufacturers/organizations in the United States. Some of these versions are not quite the same as, although close to, the ROK manufacturer version.

Second USS IWO JIMA Christened by Former CMC's Wife

PASCAGOULA, MS--The U.S. Navy christened its newest amphibious assault ship, IWO JIMA (LHD-7) on Mar. 25 at Litton Ingalls Shipbuilding here. IWO JIMA becomes the second amphibious warship named to honor the enduring legacy of the heroic participants who fought and dedicated their lives to the United States in the February 1945 Battle of Iwo Jima.

Zandra Krulak, wife of retired Commandant of the Marine Corps, **Gen. Charles C. Krulak**, served as the ship's sponsor. In the time-honored Navy tradition, Mrs. Krulak broke a bottle of champagne across the bow to formally name the ship.

Delivering the ceremony's principal address was **James Bradley**, son of Navy Pharmacists Mate **John H. Bradley**. Bradley earned the Navy Cross and the Purple Heart for extraordinary heroism on Iwo Jima and was the longest living survivor among the six men shown in the Pulitzer Prize-winning Associated Press photo of a large American flag being

raised over Mount Suribachi. This photo image has come to symbolize an epic struggle during which more than 6,000 U.S. Marines lost their lives in taking the island from the Japanese, whose losses were estimated at 20,000.

Hundreds of veterans from the actual battle, as well as former crew members of IWO JIMA (LPH-2) attended the ceremony.

Navy **Captain John T. Nawrocki**, a native of Ambridge, PA, and a 1975 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, is the commanding officer of IWO JIMA. Built by Litton Ingalls Shipbuilding, the ship is 844 feet in length with a 106-foot


beam.

The ship has living areas for nearly 3,200 crew members and embarked troops, including accommodations for nearly 450 female officers, chiefs and enlisted personnel.

Two steam propulsion plants, developing a combined 70,000 horsepower, will drive the 40,500-ton ship to speeds in excess of 20 knots.

The first ship named for the battle, IWO JIMA (LPH-2), was the lead ship of the LPH class of amphibious assault ships. It was built in the early 1960s as the first "keel-up" amphibious assault ship and was decommissioned in January 1993.
