'IWO' PHOTOGRAPHER JOE ROSENTHAL DIES

Photographer Joe Rosenthal, who won a Pulitizer Prize for his immortal image of five Marines and a Navy Corpsman raising an American flag over battle-scarred Iwo Jima, died Aug. 20. He was 94.

Rosenthal died of natural causes at an assisted living facility in the San Francisco suburb of Novato, said his daughter Anne Ros-

"He was a good and honest man, he had real integrity," Anne Rosenthal said.

His photo, taken for The Associated Press on Feb. 23, 1945, became the model for the Iwo Jima Memorial near Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. The memorial, dedicated in 1954 and known officially

as the Marine Corps War Memorial, commemorates the Marines who died taking the Pacific island in World War II.

The photo was listed in 1999 at No. 68 on a New York University survey of 100 examples of the best journalism of the century.

The photo actually shows the second raising of the flag that day on Mount Suribachi on the Japanese island. The first flag had been deemed too small.

I recently attended the dedication of a memorial to the dogs of war officially known as the Pennsylvania War Dog Memorial which was held in Bristol Township, Bucks County on Saturday, September 16, in front of the township building in Memorial Park. The event was hosted by the Delaware Valley Vietnam Veterans. Notables in attendance were Senators Vincent J. Fumo and Robert M. Tomliuson, who spearbeaded the drive and worked tirelessly in getting funding from the state making it possible to have this memorial. This has been an ongoing quest for about 10 years of finding the funds necessary for the completion of the project. You can imagine what a tough sell it must have been finding funding and donations to support a memorial for dogs. Few Americans are aware of the invaluable service given by War Dog teams during the Vietnam War. Dog teams consisting of Scout, Combat Tracker, Sentry, and Mine and Tunnel dogs saved thousands of lives. These dogs would locate injured GI's, search out Viet Cong weapon caches, locate deadly booby traps, and would alert and thwart enemy attacks and ambushes.

The War Dog teams were so effective that the Viet Cong High Command issued a bounty on them. These War Dogs served with valor and hundreds gave their lives in combat. Had it not been for the War Dogs, the "WALL" in Washington would have been a lot longer and a few feet higher.

The courage and loyalty of these dogs are honored only in the memories of the soldiers whose lives they protected.

Now for the sad part. Despite the impassioned pleas of the handlers, these valorous animals were classified as "expendable equipment" at the end of the Vietnam War and were abandoned to an unknown fate in South Vietnam.

Several of the dog handlers were present for the dedication and were introduced and participated in the unveiling of the statue. The statue depicts a War Dog on a leash with it's handler with left arm raised and fingers extended. The statue sits atop a granite pedestal with a large "V" (for valor) and in the background are three huge 8'x 4' granite tablets with inscription.

The Ceremony concluded with a 21gun salute by a firing squad of Vietnam Veterans followed with the playing of "Taps."

On Sunday the 17th, I attended the Southeast Division meeting hosted by the Valley Forge Detachment at their meeting place in Swedesburg, PA.

There were five detachments on board and about 20 members including two National officers whom are also Department officers and seven other Department officers. The meeting was chaired by the Southeast Division Vice Commandant Bob Rup. Inspite of the low turnout, it proved to be a very informative and worthwhile meeting. It was hinted that Detachments may have to consider an increase as well, however, we've already decided to keep ours at the same amount for now--at least until everyone gets over the shock of having to come up with an additional \$6.00 for National.

We also discussed territorial boundaries for Detachments as being in an area of proximity within the municipality where the Detachment is chartered. This means that in our case, Doylestown would be the only area we could use for recruiting new members and for fund raising and so on. Funny thing though, our Charter does not say Doylestown. It says Pennsylvania and as far as Γ m concerned, we can cover the whole State. Look out Washington County. Here I come!

It became known that another new Detachment is in the process of being formed in the Southeast Division somewhere in Chester County. Chester County is a big County and I'm sure that it's able to support a second detachment. I wish them luck and success.
