Highlights

The regular meeting of the Central Bucks Detachment of the Marine Corps League of Pennsylvania, Inc., was held September 9, 1998, at Albert E. Atkinson American Legion Post #210, 315 North St., Doylestown, PA.

There were 17 members present including all officers except **Sergeant-at-Arms Bob Sundling** and **Chaplain Don Parzanese, Jr.** Distinguished members in attendance included **National Public Relations Officer** and **Past Commandant Don Gee**; **Past Commandant of the Department of New Jersey Ed Hoth**; and **Marine of the Year Paul Caprio**.

Former **Marine Ray Stark** was a guest.

The Minutes of September Meeting were corrected to show that the Adopt-A-Highway Clean-Up would be held on October 17 rather than Sept. 12. The corrected Minutes were unanimously approved.

The Paymasters Report was presented by **Paymaster Bob Cody**. The Paymasters Report was unanimously accepted.

Commandant Budd Pearce reported he and other members of the Detachment had conducted a Marine Corps League Funeral Ceremony for **Joe Hazen** on Friday, Aug. 14, in Lambertville, NJ.

Senior Vice Commandant Don Gee, PC, reported the Detachment strength at 48 including 14 Life Members, 29 Regular Members, and 5 Associate Members. We still have four delinquent members.

Junior Vice Commandant Paul Caprio announced reservations for the Birthday Ball must be received by October 24 for anyone planning to attend this year's Birthday Ball at the Orion Club at NAS, Willow Grove on Saturday, Nov. 7. Cost is \$35 per person.

Embassy Marine Makes Diplomat A Believer

A foreign diplomat who often criticized American policy observed a United States Marine perform the evening colors ceremony. The diplomat wrote about this simple but solemn ceremony in a letter to his country:

"During one of the past few days, I had occasion to visit the U.S. Embassy in our capital after official working hours. I arrived at a quarter to six and was met by the Marine on guard at the entrance of the Chancery. He asked if I would mind waiting while he lowered the two American Flags at the Embassy. What I witnessed over the next 10 minutes so impressed me that I am now led to make this occurrence a part of my ongoing record of this distressing era.

"The Marine was dressed in a uniform which was spotless and neat. He walked with a measured tread from the entrance of the Chancery to the stainless steel flagpole before the Embassy and, almost reverently, lowered the flag to the level of his reach where he began to fold it in military fashion.

"He then released the flag from the clasps attaching it to the rope, stepped back from the pole, made an about face, and carried the flag between his hands--one above, one below--

and placed it securely on a stand before the Chancery.

"He then marched over to the second flagpole and repeated the same lonesome ceremony. On the way between poles, he mentioned to me very briefly that he would soon be finished. After completing his task, he apologized for the delay--out of pure courtesy, as nothing less than incapacity would have prevented him from fulfilling his goal--and said to me, "Thank you for waiting, sir. I had to pay honor to my country."

"I have had to tell this story because there was something impressive about a lone Marine carrying out a ceremonial task which obviously meant very much to him and which,

in its simplicity, made the might, the power and the glory of the United States of America stand forth in a way that a mighty wave of military aircraft, or the passage of a supercarrier, or a parade of 10,000 troops could never have made manifest.

"In spite of all the things that I can say negatively about the U.S., I do not think there is a soldier, yea, even a private citizen, who could feel as proud about our country today as the Marine does for his country.


"One day it is my hope to visit one of our embassies in a far-away place and see a soldier fold our flag and turn to a stranger and say, 'I am sorry for the delay, sir. I had to honor my country.'"

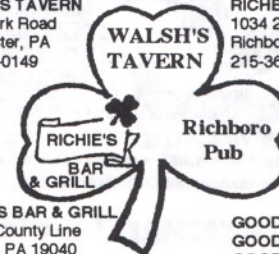
