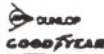

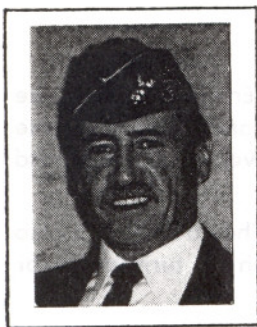

Activities of the Young Marines

On June 25, 26 & 27 our Young Marines attended the Northeast Regional Young Marine Encampment at the United States Navel Academy in Annapolis, MD. Our "Green Team" put out a maximum effort and made everyone proud of them. Our color guard looked good in their Dress Blues. They placed third in the evening Color Guard competition.

On July 4th we participated in the parade sponsored by the Huntington Valley Fire Dept. The color guard also presented the Colors at the opening ceremonies for the fireworks display. At 0900 on July 5th we turned out for another parade at Newtown Square, PA.

July 10 & 11 found our Young Marines setting up an overnight encampment at the National Guard Center in Spring City, PA.

July 14th & 28th were regular drill nights held at the Army Reserve Center on Rt. 611 in Horsham, PA and at MAG 49 at Willow Grove NAS.

Beginning Aug. 14th, the Young Marines will start drilling once a month at the 14th Marines, Golf Battery Reserve Center in West Trenton, along with regular drills at the Army Reserve and MAG 49. The 14th Marines have provided the Young Marines with office space, a storage area and a classroom.

On Aug. 15th another group of Young Marine recruits graduated from boot camp. This ceremony turned out to be rather special. We presented a few promotion in rank to some of the Young Marines and received the Meritorious Unit Commendation (Dept. Level). This was Presented to us by the Commandant of Central Bucks Detachment, Budd Pearce, in the name of the Department of PA Commandant. Commandant Pearce also presented Walt Roach with the Silver Distinguished Citizen Award from the Dept. of PA, for his continued dedicated service to the Young Marines and the Marine Corps League. Commandant Pearce presented an Honorary Life Membership in the Marine Corps League (Central Bucks Detachment) to Cpl. E. Bason. This award was presented in honor of Cpl. Bason's memory to his parents.

August 20 & 21, the Young Marines boarded a bus provided by the Christ Church of Huntington Valley (at a cost of \$400) and traveled to Anacostia Navel Yard in Washington, D.C. After breakfast we were off to the Arlington Nation Cemetery wher we placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknow Soldier. Walt Roach gave me the priviledge of commanding the wreath laying party for this special honor. It was a very moving experience. We also got in a short visit to the Iwo Jima Memorial before we departed for home. Hopefully we can repeat this trip in the not too distant future.

This is a great group of youngsters that are trying to live up to the standars, and traditions, of the Marine Corps. They deserve all the support and encouragement we can give them. They are tomorrows replacements for today's Marines.

Marine Band Announces 1993 Tour

“The President’s Own” U.S. Marine Band will perform throughout the Northeast during its 1993 Concert Tour. The band will depart Washington, DC on October 1 and will present concerts in Maryland, Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, New Hampshire, Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New Jersey, and Delaware. After performing in 49 cities, the band will return to Washington on November 21.

Marine Band Tour Director Mr. Randy Blocker says, “touring the northeast area affords us access to some of the country’s best concert halls. Highlights of this year’s tour will include performances at Symphony Hall in Boston, Carnegie Hall in New York City, and the Academy of Music in Philadelphia.”

Colonel John R. Bourgeois, Director of the Marine Band, will conduct a program that features traditional band compositions, Sousa marches, and instrumental solos. The Marine Band has been touring the United States since 1891 when John Philip Sousa, the band’s 17th director, organized the first national tour. Today, the Marine Band tours only in the fall and rarely leaves the Washington area at other times due to a heavy schedule of ceremonial commitments and public performances.

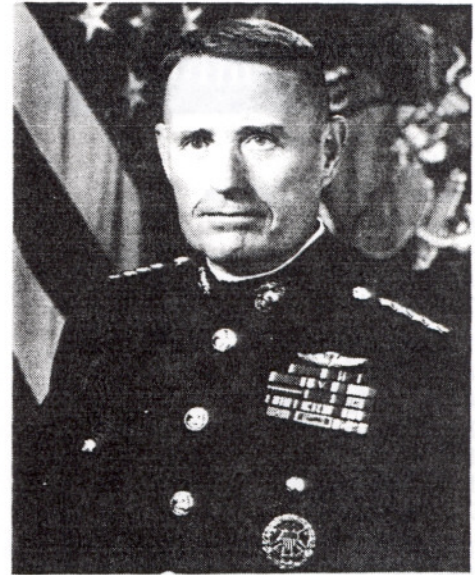


GENERAL CARL E. MUNDY JR., USMC Commandant of the Marine Corps

General Mundy was commissioned a second lieutenant in June 1957, following graduation from Auburn University. Early assignments included service in the 2d Marine Division; duty aboard the Aircraft Carrier TARAWA and the Cruiser LITTLE ROCK; instructor at the Marine Corps Basic School; and as Officer Selection Officer, Raleigh, North Carolina. In 1966-67, he served in Vietnam as operations officer and executive officer of the 3d Battalion, 26th Marines, 3d Marine Division, and as an Intelligence officer in the Headquarters, III Marine Amphibious Force.

- Commanding Officer, 2d Marines, 2d Marine Division, and 36th and 38th Marine Amphibious Units












Following advancement to brigadier general in April 1982, General Mundy's assignments have been:
